Definition of Position:

- Maximize vascular testing productivity working with office management, who has is responsible for all decisions related to patient flow and scheduling, through efficient workflow, teamwork and use of appropriate software applications including Streamline, and VidiStar
- Ensure confidentiality, security, and physical safety of patients and their data
- Maintain current policies, procedures and certification standards for ultrasonography
- Create and maintain healthy working relationships with patients, staff, referring physician offices and outside vendors
- Research and develop resources that create timely and efficient workflow, report them to your office supervisor, plan and implement, if approved

Job Eligibility Requirements:

- **Completion of an accredited ultrasound program is a must**
- Registered Diagnostic Medical Technologist
- Registered Vascular Technologist (RVT) or Vascular Sonographer (RVS) preferred
- Experience in vascular ultrasound preferred but not required
- Current BLS certification preferred

Typical Physical Demands:

- Full range of body motion including standing, walking, lifting and handling patients, as well as stretching to scan patients and simultaneously operate equipment, manual and finger dexterity, and eye-hand coordination
- Lift and carry up to 40 pounds
- Maintain normal visual acuity and hearing ability
- Ability to work under high productivity and possibly stressful conditions
- Move patients during the testing using safe body mechanics or by asking for staff assistance as needed



All Sonography Staff

- Maintain patient privacy in accordance with HIPAA
- Adhere to accepted professional and ethical standards
- Prepare exam room and ultrasound equipment to conduct sonography examinations in accordance with infectious disease, sterilization, and patient safety protocols, policies, and procedures
- Use proper patient positioning tools, devices, equipment adjustment, and ergonomically correct scanning techniques to ensure patient comfort and safety, and to prevent compromised data acquisition or musculoskeletal injury to the sonographer
- Apply independent, professional, ethical judgment, and critical thinking to safely perform diagnostic sonography procedures
- Apply independent judgment during the sonography examination to ensure that appropriate anatomical, pathological, and clinical conditions are accurately captured in the examination images
- Assume responsibility for the patient's safety during the sonographic examination
- Evaluate any contraindications, insufficient patient preparation, and the patient's inability or unwillingness to tolerate the examination and associated procedures
- Communicate with the patient in a manner appropriate to the patient's ability to understand
- Review patient medical history and supporting clinical information and use professional judgement related to the patient
- Ensure that the sonography examination order is complete, contains relevant information, and meets the standard of "medical necessity"
- Conduct clinical patient assessment and perform the exam ordered by the supervising physician in accordance with professional and facility protocols as well as professional experience. Ask Medical Director if there are any patient care issues
- As necessary, acquire additional ultrasound imaging to facilitate optimum diagnostic results for the interpreting physician
- Identify and document any limitations to the sonography examination results
- Review examination images and prepare complete preliminary findings in writing provide preliminary reports of sonography examinations for use by the interpreting physician
- Provide patient services consistent with the Scope of Practice and Clinical Standards for the Diagnostic Sonographer
- Fill out UHC and Aetna forms



Equipment Use and Maintenance

- Perform quality control procedures to ensure that the ultrasound equipment operates at optimal levels and immediately report any issues to the Medical Director
- Exercise personal responsibility to ensure that the ultrasound equipment is functioning accurately for each diagnostic test
- Assume responsibility for the preventive maintenance program for ultrasound equipment
- Ensure that appropriate ultrasound equipment is researched, selected, and approved for purchase and provide opportunities for other ultrasonographers and the Medical Director's input during the equipment selection and purchasing
- Provide positive and thorough education and training to sonographers in the utilization of equipment features and scanning techniques
- Coordinates with positive "can do" attitude bringing solutions to office supervisor, Medical Director and COO, as needed.
- Exercise responsibility for the day-to-day operation of sonography services within the facility.
- Assist with the direction and guidance for departmental workflow.
- Ensure that the sonography examination results meet the facility standard for Quality Assurance before findings are released for interpretation.
- Practice Quality Assurance protocols and Quality Improvement measures within the facility.
- Use of VidiStar structured reporting, downloading images onto external hard-drive
